

The Bugis were among the first groups of people to settle in Singapore after the British arrived in 1819. Many of the early Bugis settlers came as traders and contributed greatly to the development of Singapore.

The Bugis came from Sulawesi, an Indonesian island located between Borneo Island and the Moluccas Island. The Bugis were at first farmers and started trading 5 activities only in the eighteen century. They built trading ships, known as Phinisi and typically sailed for Singapore in October each year to benefit from the strong east winds. The Phinisi would carry items such as cotton fabrics, gold and nutmegs. The Bugis traders would sail back to Sulawesi from Singapore in January when the west winds had picked up. They would return to Sulawesi with goods such as Indian 10 cotton, iron and tobacco.

Before 1823, the Bugis lived in an area known as Kampong Glam. The area had beautiful homes and buildings that were owned by well-known Bugis businessmen. Then in 1823, the Bugis were asked to move to make way for an Arab kampong ("village" in Malay). The original Bugis settlement is no longer around. Landmarks such as the Bugis Junction shopping mall, Bugis Street and Bugis MRT station reminds us of the Bugis settlers contributions to Singapore.

Richard was sure there was an easier way to keep the lions away from his home. At first, he tried scaring them away with fire. That did not work. He noted that the brightness of the blaze probably helped the lions see better in the dark.

Next, he tried using a scarecrow to trick the lions into thinking it was a human being. However, the lions were cleverer. The animals soon realised that the scarecrow was just a dummy and they started attacking the cows again.

One night, Richard decided to do some patrolling. He walked up and down his compound for a long time, shining a flashlight out into the darkness. Surprisingly, no lions came that evening. It was then that the youngster made a discovery. Excited by this, he decided to design his very own 'lion lights' system. He tied some bulbs onto poles around his family's cattle enclosure and connected them to an old solar-powered car battery. He made the lights flash on and off at regular intervals. In the dark, it looked like someone was walking back and forth with a flashlight.

In the two years that Richard has used his 'lion lights', his home has not been bothered by the big cats at all. Seeing this, his neighbours asked Richard to install similar systems in their houses as well. The results were the same. Richard's invention has proven so effective that it is being used in other parts of the country to keep away all kinds of predators.

This translates to 1 out of 10 pedestrians jaywalking. The Straits Times also observed that besides jaywalking, other road safety hazards include risky behaviour of parents and children, pedestrians being distracted by their mobile phones and cyclists crossing the road without dismounting.

Road safety is a shared responsibility. Both pedestrians and motorists must play their respective parts to ensure the safety of all road users.

In primary school, Jobs was bored and often played pranks. His teachers reported that he was a handful to teach. Later, he went to Reed College in Oregon, but dropped out after six months. He had taken up calligraphy at Reed and said that it influenced his interest in design and the 10 eventual use of elegant fonts on Apple computers.

In 1970, he was introduced to Steve Wozinak. Together, they created the first two Apple computers. Apple's first logo had a picture of Sir Issac Newton sitting under an apple tree. Next came the rainbow striped apple with a bite taken out on the side. Later, it was simplified to a single colour.

Through Apple, Jobs was widely recognised as a charismatic pioneer of the personal computer revolution and for his influential career. Although he passed away on October 5, 2011, he continues to be fondly remembered by his peers, hailing him as a genius and genuine innovator.

"I remember one small girl I slung out of the book, who was called Miranda Mary Piker. She was the filthiest, rudest and unruliest creature you could imagine," Roald Dahl explained. In one of the early drafts, Miranda Mary Piker went swimming in the chocolate river and fell down the chocolate waterfall. Mr Willy Wonka's helpers, the Oompa-Loompas, then falsely claimed that she had been turned into Peanut Brittle, to the horror of her parents.
