The world comes together every four years to watch perhaps the greatest sporting event, the Fifa World Cup, or simply the World Cup, an international tournament which connects people from across the world, regardless of background. Federation Internationale de Football Association (Fifa), the sports' global governing body, was founded in 1904.

Prior to the World Cup, there were numerous other football competitions.

The first international tournament, the British Home Championship, took place in 1884. As football grew in popularity in other parts of the world, Fifa was determined to stage an international tournament in its own right. In the 1908 Summer Olympics in London, football for amateurs became an official 10 competition. This led to Fifa successfully staging its own international tournament outside the Olympics. With the President of Fifa, Jules Rimet, as the driving force, in 1930, Uruguay was chosen as the host country for the inaugural World Cup Tournament. Uruguay was celebrating its centenary of independence and went on to win the inaugural tournament. Since the 15 inaugural tournament, nineteen World Cup tournaments have been held and won by eight different national teams.

One cannot speak of the tournament without the mention of the World Cup Trophy. The Jules Rimet Trophy which was what it was first known as, was stolen not once but twice. It was first stolen in 1966 during a public 20 exhibition but was later recovered in South London. However, it was never recovered when thieves took off with this trophy in 1983.

Marie Tussaud was born in France in 1761. When she was a little girl, her mother worked as a housekeeper for a doctor named Curtius.

In the eighteenth century, there was no photography or X-rays. Hence, doctors often made wax copies of human body parts to teach others about health.

Dr Curtius realised that young Marie had artistic talent so he taught her how to 5 sculpt with wax. Marie became popular for her wax portraits of prominent people.

When she was just 17 years old, she was invited to live at the Royal Palace so she could teach art to the sister of the King of France.

In 1802, she left France and settled in Britain. She began touring the country, showing off her waxworks. The British were amazed by her work. Marie 10 was so successful that she was able to open a permanent exhibition in London, England, many years later. This was the first Madame Tussauds museum and is still open today. After the opening of the museum, Marie set up her most famous exhibit there - The Chamber of Horrors, where wax figures of notorious criminals, cruel leaders and famous victims are kept. Marie herself was invited to make the 15 death masks of these people by the British and French government and put them up as exhibits.

Today, there are twenty Madame Tussauds museums around the world, including seven in Asia. The museum in Sentosa include celebrities such as local actor Gurmit Singh, football player Fandi Ahmad, television actress Zoe Tay, pop singer Stefanie Sun and our first president Yusof Bin Ishak. The really fun thing is that visitors are allowed to approach the statues and even touch them. They can hold the statues' hands, hug their bodies and feel their hair. Props like leather jackets, sunglasses and hats are provided so that visitors can dress up like a star while posing for photographs.



One of the most widely known Chinese men ever to make his mark in America was Bruce Lee, a martial arts artiste. Bruce Lee was born in California in 1940 but raised in Hong Kong. He left for America in 1958. Ever since he was a child, Bruce Lee had been trained in the martial arts, and by the time he reached America, he was an expert:

At first, he had a difficult time settling into the American way of life. He worked in a 5 restaurant for a short time, but soon left to attend a local university. There, he made friends with a group of local Americans. They had never seen Chinese martial arts before and were amazed by Bruce Lee's skill in fighting. They encouraged him to open up a school, teaching others how to fight like him. He did so and the school was very successful.

Soon, Bruce Lee started to run into problems with some Chinese in America. They did not like him teaching their ancient Chinese fighting skills to foreigners and tried to stop Bruce Lee from doing this, In order to settle the dispute, Bruce Lee fought with a Chinese martial arts champion. Whoever won the fight would decide whether Bruce Lee could continue teaching Chinese martial arts to foreigners. Bruce Lee won the fight.

Soon, his martial arts school was so well-known that he was offered acting roles on television and in the movies. After a while, he left America and returned to Hong Kong to make a few movies. Bruce Lee would probably have become a very illustrious movie star if not for one thing - he died suddenly in 1973 at the age of thirty-two. Many people still remember him today as one of the greatest martial arts artistes who ever lived.

A humanoid is a robot that closely looks like a human and has an upper body, two arms, two legs and a head. It does not necessarily resemble a human in all aspects as some humanoids have a helmet instead of a face. They can respond to humans but they cannot show any emotions in what they do. They are created for the purpose of doing tedious and repetitive work.

In Germany, a humanoid has been created to perform in shows. Before it can be in a show, it has to be trained to learn about what is appropriate and inappropriate human behaviour. It also has to learn more about itself. The researcher moves its arms to give it a feel of what it is like to move one's limbs. Soon, it will learn to move its arms when it hears certain kinds of music.

The greatest scientific challenge for researchers at the moment is to get the robots to act according to their will instead of just following programmed instructions that they need to learn. They need to be able to react appropriately when interacting with humans.

Despite the excitement over the success of humanoids and the future of having them in our society, it is still uncertain about whether humans and humanoids can live 15 peacefully with each other. Watching a humanoid perform in a play on the stage is different from one serving you food at a restaurant. Can it take on the role of a teacher? Even with extensive programming, a humanoid will not be able to take on the role of a teacher fully. Can the humanoid fully express the emotions of a human like laughing and cheering when there is success or will it be emotionless? At the same time, can it control its anger in reacting to humans and channel it in a less dangerous way? These are some questions which researchers have to answer.





Gelato is a kind of ice-cream that contains about half the fat in a regular ice cream. It is made with less air and preservatives to give it a more intense flavour. It is also served at a higher temperature, which gives it a silkier texture.

Gelato is popular among Singaporeans and foreigners. There are at least 120 gelato shops in Singapore. It is therefore not surprising that Singapore is a "Gelato Capital" of Asia. Thousands of sea lion pups have ended up on beaches along the California coast. They are not there to soak up the sun. The pups are sick and without their mothers.

Sea lions are mammals that care for their pups. Sea lion pups learn to swim and hunt at about two months old. However, mother sea lions nurse their babies for six months to a year before they are strong enough to survive on their own.

Sea lions gather to breed in large colonies on islands such as the Channel Islands. The sea water around these islands is warmer than usual. The warm water is driving anchovies, sardines, squids, and other sea lions' prey away. This means that mother sea lions have to spend more time away from their pups to hunt for food.

The starving pups eventually swim away from home in a desperate search for food. However, as they are too young to travel far, the pups are drifted ashore.

California rescue centres are trying to save as many of them as possible. The workers feed them smoothies of herring, salmon oil and other nutrients to nurse them back to health.

Lim Bo Seng, a well-known war hero of Singapore, was born in China in 1909 and came to Singapore at the age of sixteen to study at Raffles Institution.

War broke out between China and Japan in 1937. Lim Bo Seng actively participated in anti-Japanese activities by boycotting Japanese goods and helping to raise funds to support the war effort in China. In 1941, he was put in charge of organising a group of volunteers in Singapore to resist the Japanese who were advancing towards Southeast Asia, including Singapore.

When war came to Singapore in 1942, Lim Bo Seng travelled to India to be trained to fight in the jungle. He later recruited and trained hundreds of secret agents and set up an intelligence network in Malaya. This network helped to collect information about their enemy's activities.

Unfortunately, there were traitors in the network, who leaked out information to the Japanese. This led to the capture of many anti-Japanese activists. Lim Bo Seng was captured in March 1944. To force him to reveal the names of the people who had worked with him against the Japanese, his captors tortured him brutally. However, he stood firm and refused to betray his comrades.

Due to the dirty living conditions in the prison, a few months after being captured, Lim Bo Seng fell ill. On 29 June 1944, he passed away due to an inflammation of the intestine. He died at the age of thirty-five, leaving behind his wife and seven children.

His children fondly remember their father as a loving father and a noble man who had lived and died for what he believed in.

The Arctic Fox is the ultimate survivor. It eats anything including insects, small mammals, birds, ducks, geese, eggs, and even an occasional Snowy Owl.

Lemmings, small mouse-like mammals, are its most common prey. Arctic foxes will eat berries and seaweed as well. When food is scarce, they become scavengers, feeding on dead animals. While they hunt for food, Arctic Foxes are preyed upon by polar bears.

Both male and female foxes help to take care of the young. While the Arctic Fox is common throughout the Arctic, it is quite rare in Norway, Sweden, and Finland. Its population never recovered from severe overhunting. In addition, global warming has caused the movement of the Red Fox into the Arctic Fox's territory, threatening the Arctic Fox's population.





"These are the people and events that made the SEA Games," he said. "This is the spirit of ASEAN and we have witnessed it at the SEA Games."

In keeping with the tradition, the SEA Games cauldron was then extinguished. The SEA Games flag was lowered and handed over to Malaysia, which will host the next SEA Games in 2017.
