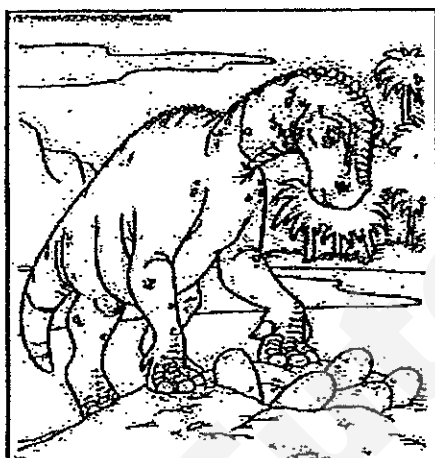

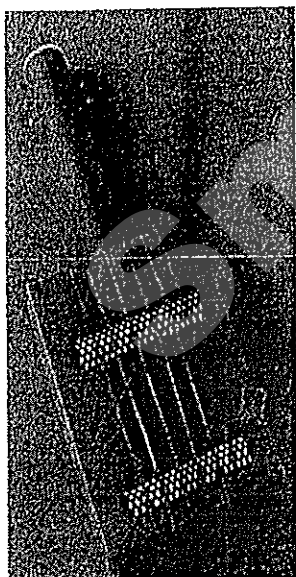
Reduce, Reuse and Recycle!

Did you know that what you think is common trash items can actually be recycled to make musical instruments? You can make a simple musical instrument using an empty shoe box in five easy steps. Try it and then groove to the music!

Make a Guitar

What you need:

- a large empty shoe box
- eight paper clips
- four rubber bands
- marker pens
- sticky tape
- a pair of scissors
- two cardboard rolls (from the inside of kitchen towels)



Instructions:

1. Cut out a big hole on the cover of the shoe box. Then use the sticky tape to tape up the cover to the box.
2. Make five small holes on each side of the box, using the tip of a pencil.
3. Push the paper clips through each of these small holes and attach a rubber band on each clip. These will be your guitar strings.
4. Tape the two cardboard rolls together. Tape them securely to the top of the box. You will hold on to this part when you play your guitar.
5. Decorate your personal guitar using the marker pens. Make it as attractive as possible and strum away.

You can also make other instruments like bongo drums from plastic containers and maracas from tin cans.

A traffic light directs traffic. It tells drivers when to stop, go and turn. A standard traffic light features a red light at the top, an amber light in the middle, and a green light at the bottom. Red means 'stop', amber means 'caution' and green means 'go'. Many traffic lights also feature red, amber, and green arrows.

The first traffic light was invented by J.P. Knight, a British engineer. It was set 5 up in London Street. This first traffic light was powered by gas, and unfortunately it exploded.

Early traffic lights were mostly hand-operated. They were placed in tall towers at intersections. A worker changed the signals. In 1918, the familiar red-amber-green trio appeared in New York City's hand-operated light towers. Such towers gave way 10 to electric traffic lights, invented in 1923 by an American named Garret Morgan.

Nowadays, many traffic lights are automatic. They are attached to control boxes that are run by timers. Some traffic lights respond to sensors that can detect waiting cars. The sensor is often an electric wire that is underground and connected to the traffic light. When a vehicle is above the wire, it sends a signal to the traffic light that 15 there is a vehicle waiting for its turn to move.

A traffic light may hang high above the street or be mounted on a tall pole along the street. This helps to direct traffic effectively.
