Comprehension Passage

The grandmaster of chess, Magnus Carlsen, entered the room. Without any introduction, he started talking about playing chess.

Remembering to be courteous, he stopped his talk on playing chess abruptly and said, "It is nice to be here. I will be starting my demonstration soon; please pay attention to the chess demonstration board. To improve your game, you may want to observe carefully. I am sure you will learn a few tricks in this demonstration." 5

The Norwegian grandmaster was in New York for a week to run a chess camp.

Carlsen spent the next hour replaying one of his games from memory. He asked the audience at certain points of his demonstration to figure out what the next move might have been. The audience **racked their brains** trying to figure out Carlsen's next move, while he sipped on his cup of coffee. 10

What was amazing was that Carlsen was able to remember every single chess move he had ever made. It was an astonishing feat, considering he had played more than 10,000 matches. He was also able to demonstrate to the audience alternative moves that a player might have taken to win the match. 15

When asked if he was shocked by a bold move by his opponent, Carlsen grinned and said, "Well, I would have seen it when I made my move."

When someone suggested a move that might lead to a draw, Carlsen chided him, "We are playing to win, not survive!"



Despite that, Sanders did not give up. He finally hit it big. He achieved his secret recipe of 11 herbs and 10 spices. The pressure cooker, a novelty at that time, was used by him for cooking his flavourful chicken. Using it reduced the preparation time and enabled him to serve more customers.

The fried chickens were so popular that the governor of Kentucky gave him the title Kentucky Colonel'. Kentucky Fried Chicken expanded internationally and it can be found in many countries around the world today. 15

Sanders passed on at the age of 90.

Even today, Sanders with his famous goatee, a white suit and a western string tie continues to symbolize delicious country fried chicken all over the world.

Read the passage carefully and answer the questions that follow.

Professor Edward Ng and his team were in an impoverished village to help the locals rebuild a school. It was then that they saw the local students coming to school in their boots.

Professor Ng thought that it was a strange sight and asked the children why they were wearing boots. The students explained that they had to cross a bridge which was actually just mud with a piece of timber on top. 5
